Caddo Parish Schools

Tuesday, 12:00 Noon



Dr. T. Lamar Goree is the longest-serving superintendent in Caddo Parish in more than 30 years and has brought innovation and stabilization to our Public Schools, a district of nearly 37,000 students and 58 schools including three charter agreements.

A product of the Caddo Public School System (both of his parents were career educators in Caddo), Dr. Goree began his career as a math teacher in Marietta, Georgia. He was soon recruited to Fort Worth as a math teacher. By 2000, he was selected to serve in his first administrative role as an Assistant Principal at Leonard Middle School where he worked for three years before becoming the school's Principal. He continued to move into more responsible positions in that

district with his last service as Area Superintendent with Mansfield, Texas ISD.

In December 2013, Dr. Goree arrived in Caddo Parish. To avoid state takeover of ten schools, Dr. Goree established the Transformation Zone which provided specialized supports, training and leadership to our district's most consistently underperforming schools. In his first three years as superintendent, the Zone led the region in academic gains, improved graduation rates, and changed the perspective of what was thought possible in high poverty, urban schools in north Louisiana.

In 2019, Dr. Goree was named the Louisiana State Superintendent of the Year. That same year he was also selected to participate in the National Racial Equity Leadership Network's second cohort. Recently he was named among the newest members of Chiefs for Change, one of the most elite education nonprofits in the nation which advocates for improved U.S. policy to support students and teachers.

Lamar joined our Rotary club in 2014 and is a Paul Harris Fellow. In addition he serves our community through his work with My Brother's Keeper, Committee of 100, Step Forward, Strategic Action Council, Caddo Children and the Youth Planning


