Washington Update

Senator Bill Cassidy grew up in Baton Rouge and attended LSU for undergraduate and medical school.

For nearly three decades he has provided care for uninsured and underinsured patients in Louisiana's charity hospital system. He co-founded the Greater Baton Rouge Community Clinic, providing free dental and health care to the working uninsured. He created a private-public partnership to vaccinate 36,000 children against Hepatitis B at no cost to the parents. In the wake of Hurricane Katrina, Bill led a group of health care volunteers to convert an abandoned K-Mart building into an emergency health care facility, providing basic health care to hurricane evacuees.

In 1990, Dr. Cassidy joined LSU Medical School teaching medical students and residents at Earl K. Long Hospital.

In 2006 he was elected to the Louisiana State Senate. Two years later, he was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives to represent Louisiana's Sixth Congressional District. In 2014 he was elected to the U.S. Senate.

Senator Cassidy is married to Dr. Laura Cassidy and they have three children.
