After more than 18 years of corporate and non-profit banking experience, Verni became the executive director of Providence House in 2015. Under her leadership, Providence House became the only 4-STAR Child Development Center in Caddo Parish.

Verni has been a finalist for numerous awards including the Virginia Shehee Influential Woman Award and the Athena Award and is a recipient of the Blue Cross Blue Shield Angel Award. She is a member of the Louisiana 4-H Foundation's Board of Directors, Christus Highland Quality, Strategic Planning/Finance Committees, the Choice Neighborhood Implementation Advisory Group, Bancorp South CRA Advisory Group and an ex-officio member of the board of Providence House. In 2021 she was a named a Top Business Professional of the Year Honoree.

Verni became a member of our Rotary club in 2016, served as a club director in 2018-2019 and is a Paul Harris Fellow.
