# Heart of Hope Civic Grant Recipient



**Heart of Hope** is a sanctuary for women that is located in the Grawood Community in Keithville. In 2007 renovations started on an unused school building and it became an 8,200 square foot home for young ladies between 11-23 years of age who are experiencing an unplanned pregnancy.

The mission of Heart of Hope is to provide a safe haven where residents can center their efforts on the decisions that are before them—being a single-parent or choosing adoption. This is the only maternity home in North Louisiana.

Our 2017-2018 civic grant committee awarded this organization a \$4,000 grant to be used to assist Heart of Hope to implement their Nutrition Program for their residents. Many teens in crisis pregnancies come from food insecure households and pregnant teens have increased nutritional needs.

Our grant money was used to provide an onsite seasonal vegetable garden and items needed for their food preservation system.

Oliver Page and his wife serve as Houseparents at Heart of Hope. Oliver is a native of Phoenix, Arizona. After a tour of duty in the Coast Guard and a short stay in

Mississippi, Oliver and his family came to Heart of Hope in 2017. Page is enrolled at a seminary majoring in Christian Ministries.
