Jon Keith

Jonathan Keith received his B.A. in history education from Trinity Christian College in Palos Heights, Illinois. He continued his education at Concordia University in Chicago where he received two M.A. degrees, in educational leadership and curriculum and instruction.

Jon found his passion in education in the year 2000 when he joined the hard working, dedicated and amazing staff at Gage Park High School in Chicago. While there, he was nominated for and accepted multiple leadership roles and developed everlasting bonds with the community.

In 2009 he was asked to join John Kinzie School to develop a new critical thinking course and to help lead the staff as Assistant Principal. Because of the success of his course there he was invited to present the project at the College Board National Conference. Not long afterward, he was recruited by the YMCA to start their first High School in Detroit.

In 2014 Jon was recruited by Pathways in Education to supervise the launch of five new schools in Northwest Louisiana. Pathways is an extremely unique educational system that provides customized and individualized approach to teaching children who are being left behind.

Jon joined our club in 2017 and was a club director in 2020-2021. He is very active in several committees: Junior Livestock, RYLA, scholarships, Sgt at Arms, raffle ticket sales and the district's disaster response team. Jon is also involved with several other service organizations (Boy Scouts, Paint Your Heart Out, Red River Clean-Up, Mudbug Madness).



Pathways in Education is a public high school serving grades 9-12 in Northwest Louisiana. Pathways considers the unique needs of every student, allowing access to small group classes, guided independent study, online courses and experiential learning, to address each student's individual strengths and needs.
