Major Voor In The Sky!




USAF Major Christin “Sparta” Voor has dreamed of flying since she was a small child in Houston. All the signs were there from the space shuttle tricycle to the Thunderbird Barbie, Voor was in love with space and flying.

Her plan was to attend the Air Force Academy to get her BS in astro-nautical engineering, then get her Masters in aero-astro engineering from MIT, then attend Euro-Nato Joint Jet Pilot Training and finally to enter the USAF Test Pilot School and get her MS in flight test engineering.

After she had completed those plans, Major Voor served as the B-52 Flight Commander at Edwards Air Force Base. She wanted to keep flying the B-52 so in 2019 she was asked to be a test pilot for the B-52 at Barksdale Air Force Base.




