Keynote Update on Caddo Parish Schools



Dr. T. Lamar Goree

Dr. T. Lamar Goree is a native of Shreveport and a graduate of Huntington High School. He received his bachelor's degree from Morehouse College, his master's degree and his Ph.D. in educational leadership from the University of Texas at Arlington.

He began his career as a math teacher in Marietta, Georgia following in the footsteps of his mother and father who were career educators in Caddo Parish Public Schools. Soon Goree was recruited to the Ft. Worth ISD where he taught math. After just a few years he was selected to serve in his first administrative role as an assistant principal at Leonard Middle School in Ft. Worth.

Soon after, Dr. Goree became a principal, then assistant superintendent and then area superintendent in the Mansfield, Texas school system.

In 2013 Dr. Goree was selected as the superintendent of Caddo Parish Public Schools and now serves over 40,000 students with 62 schools, including three charter agreements.

In addition to his work in the district, Lamar serves Caddo Parish and Shreveport through his involvement with the Committee of 100, Step Forward, Strategic Action Council, Caddo Children and Youth Planning Board, and Caddo Sheriff's Safety Town Advisory Board.



Lamar and his wife, Kimberly, met in math class during their junior year at Huntington High School. They have two children.

Not long after his return to Shreveport, Lamar was invited to join our Rotary club. He became a Paul Harris Fellow in 2016.


