
Elizabeth Eckford

About the book cover—The red represents the rage displayed by nearly 300 segregationists who gathered to prevent Elizabeth from entering Central High. The words interwoven within the crowd reflect their actions and beliefs, based

solely on difference. The blue and white gingham border represents a special detail on the dress that Elizabeth made in honor of her first day at her new school. Combined, the colors represent the bullying, bias and attacks that, unfortunately, many students continue to endure in one form or another in schools across the country.

It was 60 years before **Elizabeth Eckford** felt that she must share her story. People are being harassed in toxic environments at school, work and in our government. They endure hateful statements from their peers with no reprieve in sight.

Some people don't understand the consequence of what they say and do. Ms. Eckford hopes that by sharing her story she can make them start recognizing the impact of their behavior.




