Gregory is the founder and executive director of the Louisiana Startup, Film, Food and Music

Prizes. The award-winning Louisiana Film Prize has contributed millions in economic development for the Shreveport/Bossier area and created a beacon to attract creative talent to our area.

Gregory attended the University of Texas and received his B.S. in film. He also attended the film program at the University of Southern California. Prior to his breakout documentary *Haynesville: A Nation’s Hunt for an Energy Future*, he directed *Eating Levi*, an internationally successful film about Levi Oliver and his quest for competitive eating fame.

In 2019, the Louisiana Endowment for the Humanities selected Kallenberg as the Louisiana Champion of Culture.

On Tuesday **Katherine Dorroh** was presented with her PHF+1 lapel pin by President Lawrence. Katherine grew up in New Haven, CT. She received her J.D. degree from South Texas College of Law. Katherine is a third generation Rotarian but is the first female in her family to be a Rotarian.

In 2013 she became only the 4th female elected to the First Judicial District Court (Criminal Division) and has presided over hundreds of criminal proceedings including two capital murder trials. She was re-elected unopposed in 2020. She served as president of the Booth-Politz American Inn of Court and is leading their service projects this year.

Katherine is serving as a Club Director for us during this 2020-2021 Rotary year.

MEMBERSHIP PROPOSAL PROCESS

SATISFY MEMBERSHIP CRITERIA

From Constitution of the Rotary Club of Shreveport, Louisiana, Article VI, Section 3, "Adult persons of good character and good business and professional reputation, (a) engaged as a proprietor, partner, corporate officer, or manager of any worthy and recognized business or profession, or (b) hold an important position in any worthy and recognized business or profession or any branch or agency thereof and have executive capacity with discretionary authority, or (c) having retired from any position listed in (a) or (b) ...

INVITE TO A MEETING (first guest meeting is free for qualified potential new member)

By attending a meeting, the potential new member will have a better understanding of our club, what we do and the obligations.

SUBMIT PROPOSAL (Obtain from Executive Director)

Send completed proposal form to Rotary office or give to Executive Director.

CLASSIFICATION COMMITTEE APPROVES

Classification Committee reviews proposal for qualification for membership. If approved, committee determines proposed member's classification and submits to the Board for final approval.

ROTARY BOARD APPROVES

Proposals are submitted to the Board via email for email vote that is ratified at monthly Board meeting.

PUBLISHED IN ROTARIPOST

The name of the proposed member and proposed classification is published to the club members in the Rotaripost.

PAYMENT OF INITIATION FEE AND DUES

If no written objection is received by the Board of Directors within 7 days following publication, the proposed new member and proposer are notified and an invoice for appropriate fees is issued.

NEW MEMBER ORIENTATION SESSION

Upon payment of fees, a date is selected for an orientation and introduction to the club. The new member attends an indoctrination with a Past President prior to introduction.
