Background/Education: Grew up in New Haven, Connecticut, attended college in Newport, Rhode Island and law school in Houston.



Things You May Not Know: Love to play tennis and I'm into "plogging" (picking up litter while jogging); married to Steve Cash for 26 years and we have twin daughters


