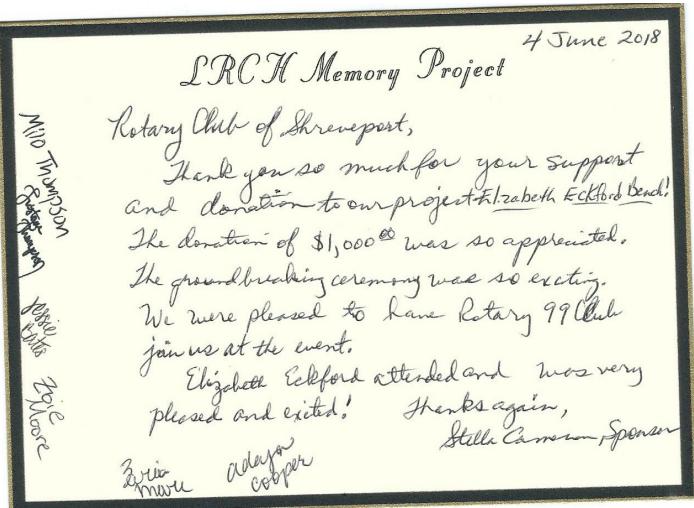
This Tuesday we will make "THE BIG REVEAL" when we announce the top vote getter for a large project for Rotary Club of Shreveport. Be sure to be there!



Little Rock Central High School Memory Project

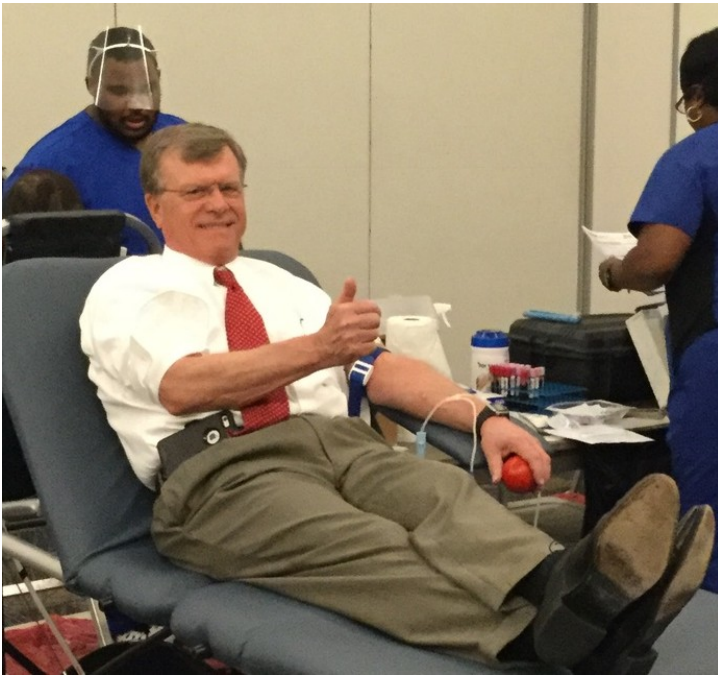

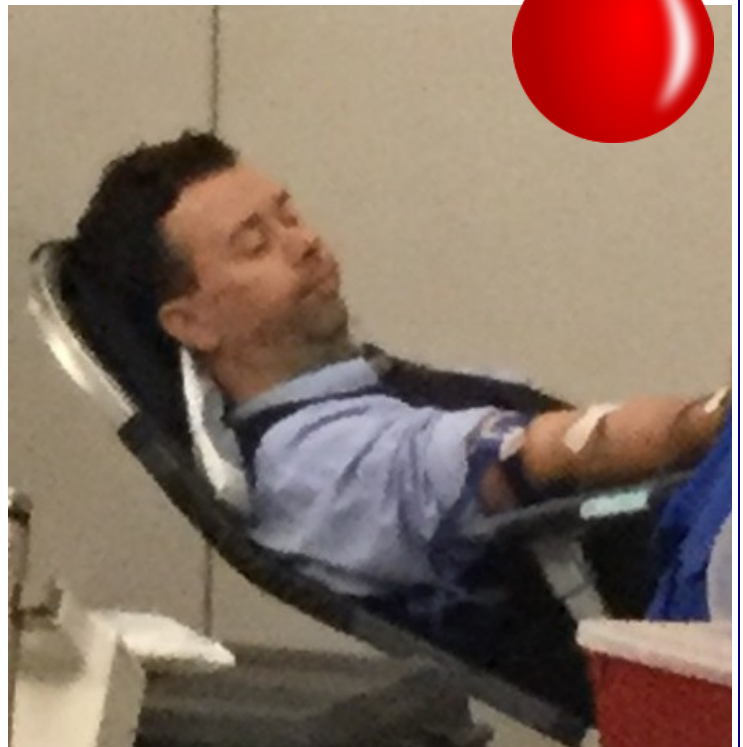
Margaret was recruited to the club in 2001 by Andrea Frenress. She has served as one of our club directors for 2017-2018 and has served on many of our committees over the years.
