## **Civic Grant Awards**



For many years our club has been awarding civic grants to local nonprofit organizations to assist with a particular project that they have. This year our grant committee began soliciting grant applications in December 2020 and accepted entries through February 19, 2021. On Tuesday we will present checks to the organizations that were selected by our Civic Grant Committee.

These awards are funded through our dues structure with assistance from the Rotary Club of Shreveport Foundation, our 501c3 organization.

We received a total of 21 applications totaling \$92,004. The total amount that we had available this year was \$22,800. The top-ranked applicants and their awards are these:

Food Bank of Northwest Louisiana-\$3,100

Shreveport Bossier Rescue Mission—\$5,000

Nowela Council, BSA-\$5,000

The Bridge Alzheimer's & Dementia Resource Center-\$4,000

Renzi Center—\$3,900

Receiving \$300 speaker honorariums are these organizations: Fuller Center for Housing, Highland Restoration, NWLA Makerspace, O.L.L.I.E. Initiative, S.C.O.R.E., and the Strand Theater.

Rotarian Wishy Nolan even uses a drone to check the remote fence lines on his cattle farm property.




