Keynote Returning To In-Person Meetings Installation of Officers & Directors

Excerpts from email message from President Rich Brontoli to membership on June 16, 2020:

We are anxious to get back to “face to face” meetings!

The Shreveport Convention Center told us we could not meet until 28 July and then they would provide box lunches. This is not acceptable, so we have checked into other facilities that could handle 100, until the Convention Center can serve a buffet.

The Petroleum Club does not have Tuesday available and parking would be an issue. Sam’s Town is not taking any groups until mid-July.

East Ridge Country Club, Shreveport; and Hilton Garden Inn, Bossier City; could both handle 100 participants, provide a buffet lunch on Tuesdays (staff will serve with gloves & masks) and they have adequate parking.

1. East-Ridge Country Club has opened their swimming pool so their parking lot may have more cars than normal. In recognition for her commitment to create career pathways for low income workers, Holy Angels was honored along with Beth Israel Hospital and Brigham and Women's Hospital with the 2014 Frontline Worker Champion Award.

She is a member of First United Methodist Church of Shreveport and United Methodist Women Circle One. Her hobbies include supporting her grandchildren's events, attending the Shreveport Symphony, LSU football and working as a pet partners team with her golden retrievers, Luke and Leia.

She was sponsored in Rotary in 2010 by Rotarian Bob Hamm, now deceased. She is a Paul Harris Fellow.

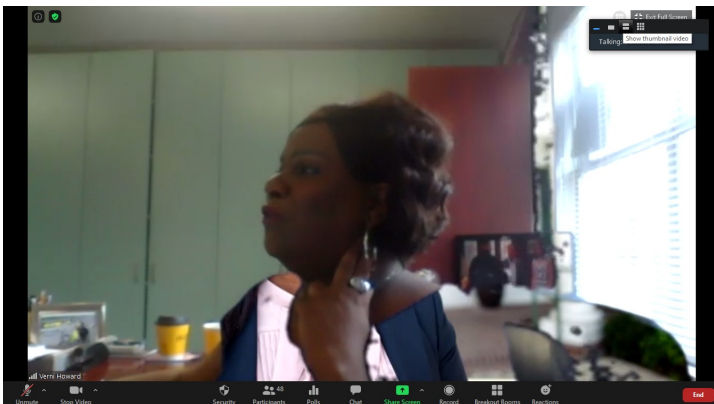
