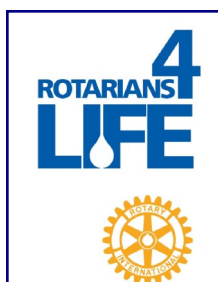
Let Judy Bellew know if you want to participate and she will get you registered.

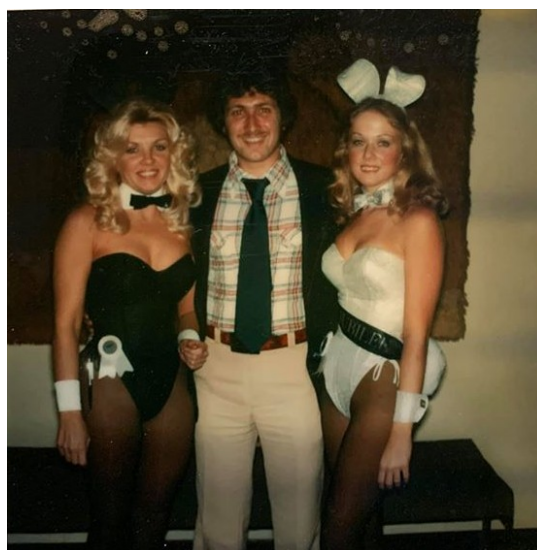
