Louisiana Museums



Thomas Carmody

Thomas Carmody, a lifelong Shreveport resident, is the Director of the Louisiana State Museums, administered under Louisiana's Secretary of State's office.

A graduate of Jesuit High School, Carmody then received his BFA degree in advertising from LSU. He worked for a number of years with Lamar Advertising Company and as a commercial real estate broker. He represented District C on the Shreveport City Council. In 2008, Carmody entered the race to represent District 6 in the Louisiana House of Representatives. He served there until term lim-

ited in 2020 when he assumed his current position with the Secretary of State's office.

Completed in 1939 the Louisiana State Exhibit Museum fell under President Roosevelt's New Deal arts program, specifically the Federal Emergency Administra-

tion of Public Works. The City of Shreveport dedicated six acres of land to the State for the building. The Louisiana Department of Agriculture's Secretary, Harry D. Wilson, spearheaded the project and administered the facility as a permanent exhibit building to complement the adjacent Louisiana State Fair and to showcase Louisiana's agriculture, industry and unique wildlife.

Federally funded projects across Louisiana in the 1930s and 40s reflected a Modernist approach for public buildings. Although not readily apparent from the street, the main structure is circular—with an open circular courtyard and a circular interior exhibit area.
