## City of Shreveport Police Department



Wayne Smith was appointed Chief of Police by Mayor Adrian Perkins on January 26, 2022, after serving as interim Chief of Police since August 2021. Chief Smith began his career with the Shreveport Police Department in August, 1980. He currently manages the day-to-day operations of the 800-plus member department. He has been assigned to all divisions of the department with successive experience in managing investigations, security, internal investigations and police personnel.

Chief Smith holds a Master of Business Administration from Centenary College and a B.S. in organiza-

tional management from Wiley College in Marshall, Texas. He is a graduate of the 174th Session of the Federal Bureau of Investigation National Training Academy in Quantico, Virginia.

He has received training in internal affairs, fingerprint classification and advanced latent fingerprint techniques, ethnic sensitivity, interview and interrogations, first responders' radiological transportation emergency, hazardous materials, supervisor training, occupant protection usage and enforcement, accident investigation along with other training seminars and workshops.

Chief Smith is married and has three grandchildren. He is an active member of Sunrise Baptist Church where he serves as chairman of the Trustee Board and is a deacon.
