Meet The Chimps

Michelle Reininger, a native of South Dakota, began her career at a Texas sanctuary working with big cats, bears, wolves and chimps.

She took the reins as Chimp Haven's Colony Director after serving on the animal Care team for five years. Michelle and her team lead husbandry and care for the colony and work tirelessly to give all of chimp Haven's retirees the best life possible.

Her favorite chimp?? Pierre—" I have known Pierre for 18 years and we just clicked from the very first time we met. He is a big boisterous

male that is known for his exuberant displays that make him seem a tough guy. However, upon inspection, he is a big softie, who likes to have his chin rubbed with a spoon."

Chimp Haven was founded in 1995 in order to respond to the need for long term chimpanzee care. The need for care extended to those chimps no longer used in biomedical research, the entertainment industry or the pet trade.

Because of their physiological and behavioral similarities to humans, chimps have been an attractive animal model for many researchers. In the 1980's the U.S. government launched an intensive breeding program. The resulting offspring were the intended research subjects for hepatitis and HIV studies; however, with new research models and developing technologies, the use of chimps in human disease research declined in the 1990's.



In 2000 the CHIMP Act was signed into law, establishing the Federal Sanctuary System. In that same year, Caddo Parish provided 200 acres of forested land in which to build the sanctuary. Chimp Haven was awarded the federal contract to create a sanctuary where its residents could live in large social groups in spacious, outdoor habitats and where they could live out their lives in a setting that afforded them greater freedoms and self-determination.
