For many years our club has been awarding civic grants to local non-profit organizations to assist with a particular project that they have. This year our grant committee began soliciting grant applications in December 2021 and accepted entries through February 2022. On Tuesday we will present checks to the organizations that were selected by our Civic Grant Committee.

Our Club's Civic Grant Awards

These awards are funded primarily through our dues structure with assistance from the Rotary Club of Shreveport Foundation, our 501(c)(3) organization.

We received a total of 29 applications totaling \$124,500. The total amount that we had available this year was \$21,800. The top-ranked applicants and their awards are these: Holy Angels—\$4,500

Songbook South—\$3,000
