

Rotary Meeting Last Tuesday

Last Tuesday the Executive Board presented their findings on meeting venues and meal costs. We have all personally experienced an increase in food costs over the last year and our local restaurants have experienced the same increase. When we began to meet again in person last August our only viable option to meet downtown was the Hilton Restaurant. The meal cost has been \$20. In order to have the best available experience for our in-person and Zoom attendees we have been charged \$5.23 per person in order to have the wonderful A/V system that we have.

With the total per plate fee of \$25.23 we maintained our walk up charge at \$20 which is what it has been since 2012 when we moved to the Convention Center. In a nutshell, we have been subsidizing our lunch cost in order to maintain the excellent food and A/V system.

To be fiscally responsible, we will now charge \$25 walk up lunch fee and guest lunch fee; and the noneater charge of \$2.00 per person will continue. This applies to guest lunches as well as the Rule of 85 (age plus Rotary years) members who opt to pay the walk-up lunch fee rather than include in their dues.

The Board will be reviewing the dues structure to determine if an overall dues increase will be needed. The Board is also considering alternate venues for our meetings in order to ensure the best possible experience for our members.
