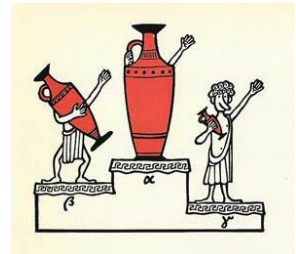

Women and Rotary

At the Large Club Conference in January it was mentioned many times that May 2017 was of great significance and that we should honor an event that happened 30 years ago.

I'm speaking about the landmark decision in the case of the *Board of Directors of Rotary International vs. the Rotary Club of Duarte, CA* (May 4, 1987).

This little club had 8 members. The male superintendent of schools invited two female school principals to join their club, Mary Lou Elliott and Donna Bogart, followed a few weeks later by Rosemary Freitag who was a psychologist.

It was strange that after the Supreme Court decision was made forcing the issue of women joining Rotary there was no communication from Rotary International until the next dues bill went out. There was never any other notice sent to the Duarte Club from Rotary International indicating agreement or disagreement with the Supreme Court decision.

A member of that same club, Susan Whitlock, became the first female president of any club in the entire world and because the first female club president to attend an international convention.

Associate Justice Lewis F. Powell, Jr. wrote, "Indeed, by opening membership to leading business and professional women in the community, Rotary Clubs are likely to obtain a more representative cross-section of community leaders with a broadened capacity for service."

One member of our club told me that this is why Rotary in the U.S. is doing well and the Rotary Club of Shreveport is doing well.
