2017-2018 Civic Grant Awards



For many years our club has been awarding civic grants to local non-profit organizations to assist with a particular project that they have. This year our grant committee began soliciting grant applications in December 2017. The results of this committee's selection were announced several weeks ago.

\$22,600 was available for the civic grants this year. Approximately 3/4 of this amount was funded with our dues structure with the remaining 1/4 funded by the net income from our golf tournament last September.

The top five ranked applicants and their projects were these.

\$5,000 to Holy Angels—support of AngelCare: Critical Support for Total Care Individuals Without Families.

\$4,000 to Gingerbread House—operational support for the comprehensive Child Advocacy Program benefiting child victims of sexual and severe physical abuse.

\$4,000 to Shreveport Bossier Rescue Mission—support of Vocational Training to the mission's guests.

\$4,000 to STARBASE Louisiana—promote STEM interests; purchase supplies for the public school 7th grade drone project.

\$4,000 to Heart of Hope—implementation of a Nutrition Program.

The grants committee is also responsible for selecting organizations to receive six \$300 speaker honorariums totaling \$1,800. These organizations were the next highest ranked for the honorariums: Alzheimer's Agency of Shreveport /Bossier, LSUS Intergenerational Literacy, Food Bank of NWLA, Community Renewal, Literacy Volunteers at Centenary College and Volunteers of America.
