Dr. Les Guice

Dr. Les Guice is the 14th president of Louisiana Tech University. He received his B.A. in architecture from Louisiana Tech and remained there to earn his master's degree in civil engineering. He then became an assistant professor in Tech's department of civil engineering. While in that position, he earned a Ph.D. in civil engineering at Texas A&M University.

He is a native of Monroe and grew up in Bastrop. Louisiana Tech has been at the forefront of Dr. Guice's entire career as he moved from the assistant professor position to various leadership positions at Tech until he was selected as President of the University in 2013.

Over time, Dr. Guice has served as a member, advisor or chairman of many organizations. He has published numerous articles in professional publications. At every step of the way, he has received honors and awards from Tau Beta Pi (national engineering honor society) to the Robert E. Russ Award presented by the Ruston/Lincoln Parish Chamber of Commerce.

Guice has been a member of the Sunrise Kiwanis Club of Ruston. He and wife Kathy have three sons and one grandson.

Message from our World Polio Day chairman Past District Governor Bob Molloy

Dear World Polio Day Project Team,

Thank you all for making World Polio Day a success here in Shreveport-Bossier City. Our goal was to raise \$10,000. I don't have the final results yet but I am sure that the total amount raised for PolioPlus will be over \$12,000. That will be over \$36,000 counting the match from the Gates Foundation.

You all formed a great team. Everyone contributed great ideas and the time to make those ideas into a reality. Everyone who took on a job made sure that it was completed.

We had four projects that were identified. They were:

Skip-a-Meal. We didn't know how to implement that in most clubs so we put the word out to clubs and we let them decide to do it or not. The BPCCRotaract Club did it and presented a check for \$120.

Restaurant Every Night. We did two nights. The night at Ernest's was a great success not only because Ernest donated \$900 but because of the good food and fellowship that all of the Rotarians and others enjoyed. The night at Newk's made \$123 for PolioPlus.

5K Race. The race turned into a walk at the Boardwalk. We didn't get as many participants as we had hoped but those that participated had a good time. I don't have the final amount on this yet.

Purple Pinkie Project. The BPCCRotaract Club handled that for us at the walk and took in \$81.

My takeaway is that the Rotary Clubs and Rotaract Clubs (maybe even Interact Clubs) in the area are strong and make a good team while working together. My suggestion is that we all work together in the near future and do a local project that will have a BIG impact on Shreveport-Bossier City and will let the community know that Rotarians can BE THE INSPIRATION.
