**Jim Malsch**, a local visionary, graduated from Louisiana Technical College-Shreveport in 1986 and envisioned a world with a need for computing skills. After working for a couple of years as a systems engineer, he founded Enterprise Computing Services LLC here in Shreveport and served as its CEO for 25 years until he sold the company.

Since 2016 he has been the managing member of JRM Ventures, LLC. In early 2020, Malsch purchased the Andress building, located at 717 Crockett to create the An-
