## Fairground Field Development



## **Centenary Scholarship Awarded by Rotary Club of Shreveport**

The James Allen, Jr. Memorial Scholarship Award was created in 2003 by our late club member Jimmie Allen and his wife through a bequest to the Rotary Club of Shreveport Foundation, honoring their deceased son, James Allen, Jr. a Centenary alumnus.

The stipulation of the bequest was that the income be used to provide an annual scholarship to a deserving Centenary student. Each year, we ask the Centenary financial aid director to assist in identifying a Centenary student who clearly exhibits the character traits of scholarship, personal integrity, and a dedication to Service Above Self (Rotary International's long standing principal motto), either through extracurricular activities, career plans, or both.

Rotarian Jimmie Allen passed away on September 28, 2011 and our club makes the presentation each year to coincide as closely as possible to that date. Last Tuesday, we recognized the 2022 recipient of this \$2,000 award, Ms. **Vernesha Trenel Martin**, who joined us by Zoom. Alan Prater, our scholarship chair presented the check to Centenary's President Dr. Chris Holoman on Ms. Martin's behalf.

Ms Martin graduated in May 2019 from Woodlawn High School in Baton Rouge. She will graduate from Centenary in May 2023 in business administration with a concentration in international business with minors both in political science and economics. She has a current GPA of 3.65. Her goal is to become a sustainable architect to provide affordable housing to those in low-income and environmentally at-risk regions.

She is Vice-President of Institutional Affairs for the Student Government Association and is the representative linkage between student and faculty/administration. Serving in the Black Student Union, her group encourages all demographics of students to join to emphasize inclusivity, understanding and a sense of community amongst Centenary as a whole. She is one of nine students to be invited to join the Sigma Beta Delta International Honor Society.


