Born and raised in the Midwest, **Morgan Feigal-Stickles** left to explore how the world works. He studied chemistry at Macalester College, volunteered with AmeriCorps in Seattle and worked in outdoor education in New England.

In 2013 he began working for StoryCorps and joined their Mobile Tour as the site manager. Through this work, he has facilitated over 420 interviews in 55 cities across 30 states. He enjoys satisfying his wanderlust by bearing witness to the world's stories.

StoryCorps was "born" in 2003 with the opening of a storybooth in Grand Central Terminal in New York City. Its weekly broadcast debuted on NPR's Morning Edition in 2005.

The StoryCorps mobile Airstream is parked at the Broadmoor branch of the Shreve Memorial Library. MEMBERSHIP PROPOSAL PROCESS

SATISFY MEMBERSHIP CRITERIA

From Constitution of the Rotary Club of Shreveport, Louisiana, Article VI, Section 3, "Adult persons of good character and good business and professional reputation, (a) engaged as a proprietor, partner, corporate officer, or manager of any worthy and recognized business or profession, or (b) hold an important position in any worthy and recognized business or profession or any branch or agency thereof and have executive capacity with discretionary authority, or (c) having retired from any position listed in (a) or (b) ...

INVITE TO A MEETING (first guest meeting is free for qualified potential new member)

By attending a meeting, the potential new member will have a better understanding of our club, what we do and the obligations.

SUBMIT PROPOSAL (Obtain from Executive Director)

Send completed proposal form to Rotary office or give to Executive Director.

CLASSIFICATION COMMITTEE APPROVES

Classification Committee reviews proposal for qualification for membership. If approved, committee determines proposed member's classification and submits to the Board for final approval.

ROTARY BOARD APPROVES

Proposals are submitted to the Board via email for email vote that is ratified at monthly Board meeting.

PUBLISHED IN ROTARIPOST

The name of the proposed member and proposed classification is published to the club members in the Rotaripost.

PAYMENT OF INITIATION FEE AND DUES

If no written objection is received by the Board of Directors within 7 days following publication, the proposed new member and proposer are notified and an invoice for appropriate fees is issued.

NEW MEMBER ORIENTATION SESSION

Upon payment of fees, a date is selected for an orientation and introduction to the club. The new member attends an indoctrination with a Past President prior to introduction.
