Keynote

World Polio Week



John A. Vanchiere, M.D., Ph.D. is the Chief of LSU Health Shreveport Department of Pediatrics Infectious Diseases Section.

Dr. Vanchiere earned his doctorate from Emory University before completing both residency and fellowship training at Baylor College of Medicine. He is the current President of the Louisiana Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics. He is a second-generation pediatrician from Lake Charles.

Not only has he treated children with a broad array of diseases caused by germs, viruses and fungi, ranging from flu to hospital acquired infections to pneumonia, Dr. Vanchiere is familiar with the effects that the poliomyeli-

tis viral infection can have on a culture.

Rotary and Rotarians have been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years. The goal of ridding the world of this disease is closer than ever. As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, Rotary has reduced polio cases by 99.9% since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979.

In 1988 Rotary formed the Global Polio Eradication Initiative with the World Health Organization, UNICEF and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance later joined.

The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation donates \$2 for every \$1 that a Rotarian donates to the Polio Plus campaign. Not only do our donations purchase the vaccine, but the "plus" is something else that is provided as a part of the polio eradication campaign. It might be a handoperated tricycle for a polio patient or access to clean water. It might be additional medical treatment, bed nets or soap.


Last Week's Program

During his free time, he enjoys playing basketball and golf and doing volunteer work.


