She served in several management roles with the South Carolina State Department of Education and taught subjects at the high school, technical college and university levels. She has spoken in all 50 states and 72 countries on educational issues and/or The Rotary Foundation.


A member of the Rotary Club of Columbia East, she has served as District Governor 1999-2000, Rotary International Vice President 2013-2014, Rotary International Director, Trustee for The Rotary Foundation, just to name a few.

Anne is Chair of the Polio Eradication Advocacy Task Force for the U.S. and is a member of the International PolioPlus Committee. She has participated in Polio National Immunization Days in India and

participated in humanitarian work in Kenya, South Africa, Ghana and the Amazon Jungle.

Her honors from Rotary International include the Citation for Meritorious Service Award, the Service Above Self Award and the Distinguished Service Award. She has been honored as Rotarian of the Year in her District and honored with the Betsy Demaray Award by Rotary Global History Fellowship. In June 2017 during the Rotary International Convention in Atlanta, Anne received the International Service Award for a Polio-Free World from The Rotary Foundation.

Rotary's World Polio Day is October 24th of each year.




Ethan Hagan at our meeting last Tuesday.
