Keynote Cyber Innovation Center and Their Educational Outreach



Kevin Nolten currently serves as the Director of Academic Outreach for the Cyber Innovation Center. He oversees the operations of the National Integrated Cyber Education Research Center (NICERC).

NICERC, an organization funded by a multi-million dollar federal grant, is charged with developing STEM, cyber, and computer science curricula, professional development and other resources for K-12 educators, school districts and state departments of education across the country.

Their goal is to empower educators as they prepare the next generation to succeed in the cyber workforce of tomorrow.

Kevin is a native of the Shreveport Bossier area. After graduation from Caddo Magnet High School, he completed his formal education at LSUS where he graduated with his undergraduate and master degrees. While at LSUS Kevin was one of the driving forces in the Rotaract Club there. In talking about that experience he shared that his "fondest memory of LSUS was being involved in the LSUS Rotaract Club. This student organization was instrumental in teaching college students how to give back to the community. The team of students organized several Black Tie...or Not Benefit Balls that raised money for the Shreveport Bossier Rescue Mission."

After a brief tenure as director of marketing and then as assistant principal at St. Joseph Catholic School, Kevin joined Cyber Innovation Center.

Kevin, a Paul Harris Fellow, is a member of the Rotary Club of South Shreveport. He served as their club president in 2013-2014.
