After receiving his B.S. in mechanical engineering and business administration from LA Tech, Bob got his journeyman plumbing license and started working full time with Fitzgerald Contractors going from a journeyman plumber, service estimator all the way to CEO. He retired from that position in 2012.

Bob is active on several key committees at St. Mark's Episcopal Cathedral. Other boards that he has served on are Chamber of Commerce, Committee of 100, American Red Cross, Shreveport Club, LSU Shreveport Foundation. He is a 2015 inductee (laureate) in the Junior Achievement Business Hall of Fame.

Bob shared that he knows of the tremendous work that Rotary is doing to eradicate polio. His sister suffered from polio as a child and is now having to deal with post polio syndrome.
